**Subject**: Thomas Joyce (1722 - 1780) of Charlotte County, Virginia

<u>Background</u>: Baptized on October 4, 1722 at 1<sup>st</sup> Ballynahinch Church in County Down, Ireland, Thomas is later documented in Louisa County, Virginia on July 28, 1747. Alexander Joyce (1720-1778) a brother to Thomas is baptized in January 1720, and also likely appears in Louisa County and Lunenburg County, Virginia.

**Research objective**: Is the Alexander Joyce who appears on August 15, 1748 in Louisa County, Virginia, the brother of Thomas Joyce (1720-1778) who was born in County Down, Ireland.

### <u>Summary: [All facts are fully citied in this report].</u>

Recorded as being baptized on October 4, 1722 at 1st Ballynahinch Church in County Down, Ireland, Thomas was one of seven children. Born to Thomas Joyce and Mary Blakley, he also had a brother Alexander baptized in January of 1720. Little is known about Thomas (1720-1780) until he is recorded in Louisa County Virginia on July 28, 1747 in the county court. One year later on August 15, 1748 in the same county an Alexander Joyce is present as witness in a land deed in Louisa County. After finding evidence that Thomas had purchased 400 areas of land in Lunenburg County, Virginia, on May 10, 1748, it also became clear that an Alexander Joyce had purchased 800 acres of land in Lunenburg County on the same day. After studying the will of Alexander Joyce where Alexander describes Thomas as "my brother," it became evident they were brothers. MORE INFORMATION IS FOUND IN THE DETAILED FINDINGS

In March 3, 1778, in Alexander Joyces' will, he mentions Thomas Joyce as "my brother". (See Attached F)

Subject: Thomas Joyce

"In the name of God Amen, I Alexander Joyce of Guilford County in the State of No. Carolina being at this time very weak in body but of sound and [word unreadable] mind and memory.....make this my last will and testament.....to my beloved wife Jane Joyce three negros Ned, Sue, & Peggy and two hundred & fifty acres of land including the planation where I now live.

"I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Joyce one hundred pounds in money...

I give and bequeath to my son John Joyce five hundred and twenty six acres of land lying in Pittsylvania in the State of Virginia on Sandy River....

I give and bequeath to my son James Joyce one negro man named Bill and one hundred pounds in money...

I give and bequeath to my son Elijah Joyce two hundred of land.....and one negro woman named Amy and one hundred pounds in money....

I give and bequeath to my son Alexander Joyce one hundred pounds in money and one negro boy named [name unreadable]...

I give and bequeath to my son Elisha Joyce a tract of land including the mill, one negro woman named Sarah and one hundred pounds in money...

I give and bequeath to my son Andrew Joyce forty two hundred acres of land of the land...lying on both sides [of] the river, one negro boy named [Steve?], and one hundred pounds in money...

I give to my daughter Sarah....ten pounds in money and two cows...

I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret one negro girl named Amy, one horse and saddle, one bed and furniture and one spinning wheel..

I give and bequeath to my daughter Esther Joyce one negro girl named Sarah, one horse saddle, one bed and furniture and one spinning wheel...

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Joyce one negro named Jenny, one horse and saddle, one bed & furniture and one spinning wheel...

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Joyce two negro Jacob & Agnis, one horse and saddle, one bed and furniture and one spinning wheel...

I give and bequeath to my son Elisha Joyce one horse saddle and bridle..

I give to my son Andrew Joyce one horse saddle & bridle...

I give to my beloved wife Jane & son Elijah my still....

I give and bequeath to my loving wife Jane one black mare called Tibb, one saddle & bridle

My further will and desire is that all the residue of my estate....be sold at publick auction to my

Executors and the money arising from the sale (after reserving one hundred pounds [word unreadable] for the education of my little children, Elisha, Andrew, Robert, Margaret, Elizabeth & Mary) be equally divided amongst my sons, John, James, Elijah, Alexander, Elisha, Andrew & Robert Joyce.

Subject: Thomas Joyce

Lastly I also hereby.....appoint my son James Joyce, Elijah Joyce, and my brother Thomas Joyce and my trusty friend Patrick Hamilton, executors of this my last will and testament hereby...making void all former wills by me heretofore made ratifying this...to be my last will & testament."

#### **Recommendations for Further Research:**

Subject: Thomas Joyce

• Research the John Joyce of Louisa County, Virginia: In 1743 a John Joyce also appeared in Louisa County, Virginia. Further research might show if he is the brother of Thomas and Alexander who was baptized on May 25, 1718.







Thomas Joyce May 10, 1748 Deed Lunenburg County, Virginia




